

The 5000 Trees Project

Promoting tree planting to fight climate change.

In Grand Bend, we love our trees! They're beautiful and provide shade and privacy. They also take up carbon, helping to reduce climate change.

Sadly our community has lost many trees over the past year, due in part to the 2014 tornado and damage caused by the Emerald Ash Borer. It's time to get together and start planting! Our goal is to plant 5,000 native trees by 2025.

Here's how you can get involved:

- Order 20 or more trees from the Ausable-Bayfield Conservation Authority (order form attached) for spring planting and receive a discount of \$50 (per address in NoM 1To postal code). Orders must be received by February 28, 2015. There is a limited number of trees available at this price, and they will be sold on first-come, first-serve basis.
 - If you don't need 20 trees yourself, get together with your neighbours to take advantage of this great deal!
- Attend one of two *free* 5000 Trees Forums to learn how to plant and care for your new trees.
 - April 18, 10-11:30 a.m., Grand Bend Area Community Health Centre
 - May 2, 10-11:30 a.m., Grand Bend Area Community Health Centre
- Pick up your trees on May 9. The location will be announced. There will be some additional trees for sale at the discounted price at that time.
