

The Lucan Conservation Area contains quite a few species of plants for its size. The majority of the trees are maple and other hardwoods. You will notice that most of the trees here are tall and thin. They are competing for sunlight, so they use all their growth to go up, not to thicken. The rest of the plants tend to be small, like grasses and wildflowers.

Animals are small, as there is not enough room to truly support larger animals. Mice, squirrels, snakes, frogs, and songbirds are all here for you to enjoy, though.



### Rules for use of the Conservation Area

- Check the sign board for permitted uses.
- Promote safe and responsible trail use.
- Be courteous and share the trail with other users.
- Stay on the marked trail and don't create new ones.
- Place litter in the provided receptacles.
- Park only in designated areas.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash no longer than 2 metres (6 feet). Clean up after your pet.
- Do not injure, damage, or remove any plant, animal, or structure.
- Report vandalism and incidents to the ABCA.
- Horses, motorized vehicles and bicycles of any kind are not permitted.
- Campfires are only permitted in the provided barbeque.
- Hunting and camping are prohibited.

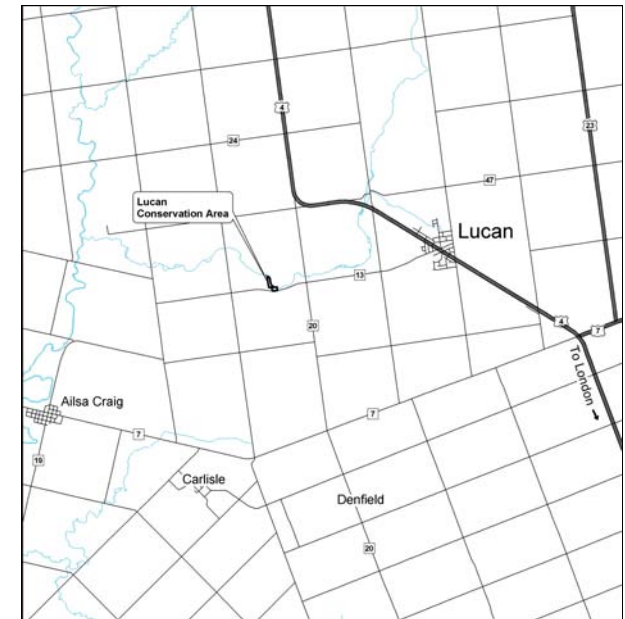
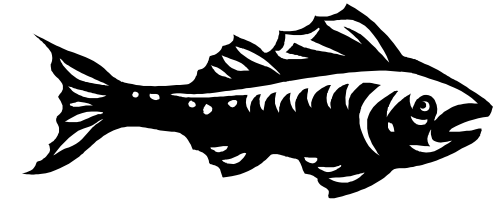
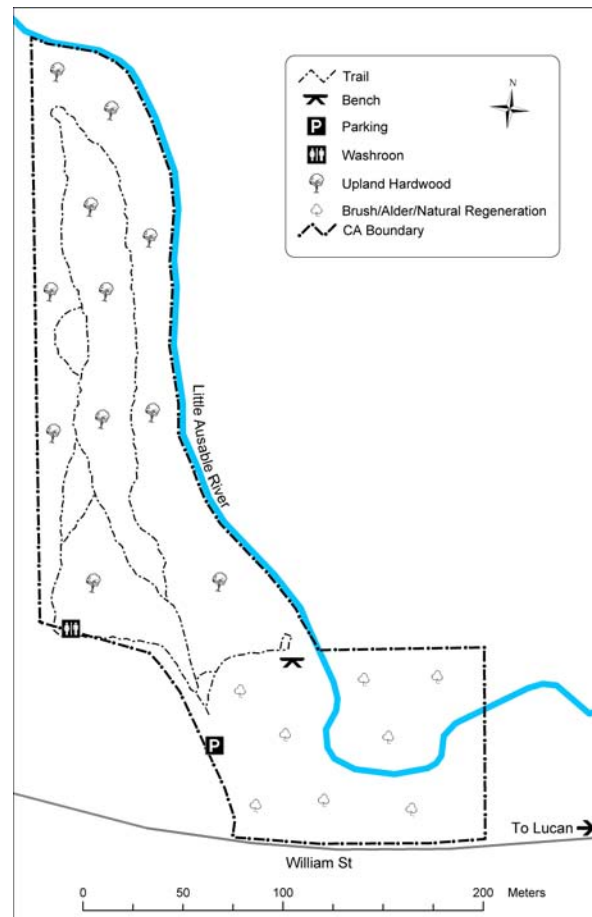

Welcome to the Lucan Conservation Area. Please enjoy your visit and please respect the area so others may enjoy it also. If you are interested in observing the birds and wildlife, dusk and dawn are the best times to see animals. Please observe wildlife from a distance and let them go about their activities— you're visiting their home.

The Lucan Conservation Area is a small, secluded area just off Highway 4. An extremely serene setting, it works well as a picnic or break area on a long drive. It could also serve as an area for a short fitness walk for those who have a busy schedule, or for those who don't want to feel overwhelmed by huge expanses of wilderness. You are allowed to fish in the Little Ausable River.



The Lucan Conservation Area provides a peaceful, relaxing walk through a hardwood forest along the Little Ausable River. The walk does not take long, and the paths are not at all demanding. There are also areas for picnics and campfires for a small taste of outdoor foods.
