Rules

These rules protect you and others. They are enforced by *Conservation Authorities Act* and *Trespass to Property Act*.

- Motorized vehicles, bicycles, horses, hunting, alcohol use, drone use, fires and camping are *not* permitted.
- Keep dogs on a leash and under control always and clean up after dog.
- Do not remove or damage plants, trees, wildlife, signs or structures.
- Fishing is permitted following all applicable provincial laws.
- Do not litter. Put waste in provided container or take it home with you.
- Smoking permitted following all applicable Provincial laws.

About Parkhill Reservoir

- Parkhill Reservoir is 104 hectares (257 acres) with open areas over sheltered coves.
- Getting out on the water in a canoe, kayak, or boat (electric motor only) is a favourite summertime activity.
- Parkhill Reservoir offers still, flat waters to be enjoyed by all skill levels. The boat launch parking lot has lots of room for parking your vehicle and trailer.
- Some common fish are Largemouth Bass, Brown Bullhead, White Crappie, and Yellow Perch.
- Water is all around this park. Migrating Warblers and even Bald Eagles have been spotted here. Bring your binoculars.
