BUSINESS OUT OF THE MINUTES

Proposed 2016 Budget

Brian Horner, General Manager presented revisions to the proposed 2016 budget discussed at the previous meeting. The Board of Directors had requested staff to prioritize the projects and reduce the combined levies to a 2% increase. Removed from the budget was purchasing a back-up generator and outsourcing the Director's Orientation Handbook. The Natural Heritage Study will be phased over two years; CA Lands Species at Risk project will be funded from anticipated surplus and the Watershed Hydrology Study will be funded from reserves. After discussion, it was decided to reduce the wages from a 2% CPI increase to 1.5%. The changes recommended by staff will achieve a combined project and general levy increase of 2.0%.

FURTHER, THAT the member municipalities be advised of the 2016 proposed project levy, general levy and budget and provided with the supplementary information for the 30 day review, as the weighted vote by apportionment is intended to be held at the November 26, 2015 Board of Directors meeting."

PROGRAM REPORT

1 (a) Development Review

Andrew Bicknell presented the Development Review report pursuant to *Ontario Regulation* 147/06 Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alterations to Shorelines and Watercourses. Through the application process, proposed developments within regulated areas are protected from flooding and erosion hazards. Staff granted permission for 6 Applications for Permission and 6 Minor Works Permits to construct works within regulated areas.

(b) Violation/Appeals Update

- (i) Geoff Cade, Supervisor of Water and Planning reported staff were advised of a violation in the Municipality of Lambton Shores within Lakeshore Area 1. A permit was issued for approved construction works of a residence, however the landowner has contravened the conditions of the permit. Staff are working through the violation and permitting process with the landowner.
- (ii) Staff received a report on vegetation removal in the Municipality of Bluewater where the lake bank has been clear-cut and burned.

2. Rock Glen Conservation Area Low Flow Crossing

A low flow culvert crossing over the Hobbs-McKenzie Drain provides access to the majority of the facilities at Rock Glen CA. The cement is being eroded away and water is travelling beneath the culvert undermining the structure. Staff are concerned with the integrity of the structure and feel it requires emergency replacement.

4. Third Quarter Financial Statement

Brian Horner presented the Statement of Profit/Loss to September 30, 2015 with comparatives to the 2015 approved budget.

PRESENTATION

Kate Monk, Stewardship, Lands & Education Manager gave an overview of the ABCA conservation lands management program The ABCA owns 9,000 acres of wildlife management areas, agreement forests, conservation areas and management areas. The properties were acquired to protect valley lands and alleviate property damage from flooding. As owners of conservation lands there is always pressure to find a balance between environmental goals and the public's expectation to use the lands for recreation. Across the province there are 270 conservation areas. Staff continue to seek funding to maintain aging infrastructure. Managing the conservation areas involves maintaining trails with the help of volunteers; being diligent to keep trails safe and free of hazards; patrolling to keep ATVs off of conservation lands; removing dead ash trees and harvesting the conifer and hardwood forests. A "good dog program" was initiated with support of Miller's Country Store. Patrol officers will give out donated dog treats whenever they meet a dog owner along a trail, who has their pet on a leash. Conservation passes are required to hunt on ABCA lands where hunting is permitted.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Brian Horner presented the General Manager's report. Highlights were given on the progress of various projects, staff training and development, upcoming meetings and activities held over the previous month. This report is distributed to the municipalities for their councillors' information.
