PROGRAM REPORTS

1. (a) Development Review

Andrew Bicknell, Regulations Coordinator presented the Development Review report pursuant to Ontario Regulation 147/06 Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alterations to Shorelines and Watercourses. Through the application process, proposed developments within regulated areas are protected from flooding and erosion hazards. Staff granted permission for 2 *Applications for Permission* and 4 *Minor Works Permits*.

1. (b) Violation/Appeals Update

Staff reported they are working cooperatively with the Port Franks landowner so that a basement renovation is returned back to an area for storage as agreed to in the permit. In the Municipality of Bluewater, the structure built on the beach that received a violation notice has been referred to the solicitor.

2. Rock Glen C.A. Culvert Replacement Tender Opening

Kate Monk, Stewardship, Land & Education Manager presented the results of a tender to replace the internal road culvert crossing at Rock Glen Conservation Area. There were three bids received from local contractors.

3. Shoreline Management Plan

Alec Scott, Water & Planning Manager advised that the consultants undertaking the Shoreline Management Plan (SMP) Update project are requesting additional funds. The consulting team are to update or confirm the estimates for long term erosion rates along the bluff area of the shoreline, as identified in the Shoreline Management Plan, 2000. They proposed investigating an alternate approach using 1973 photo mosaics which were used by the federal government in preparing the Coastal Zone Atlas. The increase requested is \$2,800 reflecting the extra time required. This approach would reduce the costs for the ABCA to purchase additional historic photography for the erosion rate review so remains within budget.

Brian Horner presented the unaudited profit and loss statement to December 31, 2015 for the Board's information. The audited 2015 financial statement should be available at the next meeting.

PRESENTATION

Jenna Allain, DWSP Project Supervisor and Mary Lynn MacDonald, Risk Management Official (RMO) gave a presentation outlining the risk management services being delivered to eight municipalities in the Ausable Bayfield Maitland Valley Source Protection Region. Responsibilities include protection of 28 drinking water systems and approximately 200 risk management plans. The RMO duties include reviewing development applications, issuing notices, negotiating and establishing risk management plans, delivering education and outreach,

monitoring and enforcing policies within the Source Protection Plan and reporting to the province.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Brian Horner provided a written report with a brief update on the progress of various projects, staff training and development, upcoming meetings or events and general activities over the previous month.

Directors and Officers Liability Insurance

Paul Speck of Marsh Canada Ltd. gave a presentation on Directors and Officers' Liability Insurance. The purpose of this liability insurance is to protect and defend personal assets of directors and officers. It is the responsibility of the insurance company to defend and pay when there are claims. Directors can come from all walks of life, but when appointed to a Board must act in the best interest of the entity. In situations where staff make recommendations and the Board overrules the decisions, the liability insurance will cover directors as long as there is no personal gain.
