

# Pick the Path

Do you know which of these things belong in the recycling bin? Follow the paths to find out if you're right. The numbers along one of the paths add up to exactly 100. Which path is it?

Use the recycling program in the Ontario Parks you visit.

Recycling one tonne of newspaper saves almost 20 trees!

The maze is shaped like a recycling symbol and contains several items and numbers. Items include a paint can, a tree, a bird, a glass bottle, a cardboard box, a battery, and a duck. Numbers are placed along the maze paths.

If all the glass bottles and jars recycled in a year in Canada were laid end to end, they would circle the Earth.

Why recycle? When waste is recycled, industry uses it to make new materials. It takes less energy to make new products from recycled ones than from raw materials. Less energy means less rapid climate change.

ANSWERS:

The path from the cardboard box to the bin adds up to 100. The old celery can go to the compost. Paint and batteries go to the hazardous waste centre. The rest can be recycled in most communities.
